Community Development Block Grant (CDBG): Issues and Updates

<u>What's new:</u>

2024 Guidelines:

Public Facilities applications must now include a letter from the provider stating that they agree with the project and have the capacity to serve the proposed project.

Labor:

The USDOL is revising the Davis Bacon regulations. Some of the changes are:

- Exempt Workers: re-defined the classification
- Truck Drivers: re-defined when DB applies
- Demolition: is no longer exempt
- Wages Rates: changed when a new decision is required on an on-going project.
- When two wage classes apply: If one class is 20% or more of the project cost, or over \$2.5M

<u>Labor Continued:</u>

When is a new wage decision required?

- Contract or change order:
 - to include additional and substantial work
 - to require the contractor to perform work for an additional time period
 - an option to extend the term of the contract

There is also a clause on the contract's award anniversary, if certain criterion apply

<u>What's new:</u> 24 CFR Part 58 - Environmental

Radon 24 CFR 50.3(i) 7 58.5(i)(2)

- Requires consideration of radon gas in buildings.
- Radon testing is not required HOWEVER mitigation IS REQUIRED if levels exceed 4.0pCi/L or greater

HUD Federal Flood Risk Management Standard (FFRMS) 24 CFR Part 55

- Expands the concern from the 100-year floodplain to a newly defined FFRMS floodplain
- Prefers the use of Climate Informed Science Approach (CISA) to determine the floodplain of concern
- Updates HUD's Minimum Property Standards
- This does not replace the requirements set forth in Part 55, just expands



What's new: Part 200

Part 200 Changes

- Substantial Improvement Elevation Requirements
- Manufactured Housing Elevation
- On Site Floodway

Environmental Reviews:

- Conducting the correct level of review
- Using the correct forms
- Completion of the forms
- Exempt activities a written determination MUST be made and placed in the ERR prior to incurring expenses
- Using the correct language in the Notices
- Calculating the appropriate comment periods

<u>Issues / Concerns: Payments</u>

New: We now require invoices with every request

Issues with Draw Requests:

- Not including the applicant's name, instead using the project name
- Not properly numbered
- Miscalculations
- Not completing the Use of Other Funds
- Not completing the Project Status
- On ARC draws not including the ARC assigned number
- On ARC not including the Additional information sheet
- Timely submittal
- You should never have "cash on hand".
- If your city or county has <u>program income</u>, please enter that amount on the draw sheet.
- If you have Program Income on the books with DLG, you must apply that to your recently awarded grant or your next application.



<u>Issues / Concerns: Financial</u>

New:

- The audit threshold will rise to \$1,000,000 in October.
- Please use updated forms, PI reports, PCR, public notice, etc. downloaded, before submission, from the DLG web page or handbook.




Non-Continuous Survey




Local Surveys and Census Continuous Survey

 - www.randomizer.org
 - Make sure that you have randomized enough households to establish a correct minimum survey amount.
- 100% Survey



STEP 4 – Conduct the Survey

- Must be door-to-door, in person
- No phone calls
- No mail surveys



STEP 5 – Determine the Results

- Complete Survey Data
 - Only use data from valid, completed surveys
 - Clarify any errors or omissions
- Complete LMI Worksheet



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


Sample Service Area






Sample Service Area

HUD LMI vs.

HUD LMI

- Uses same Confidence Interval (90%) as U.S. Census Bureau
- Uses same MOE (10%) as U.S. Census Bureau
- As of 2018 had disallowed the ability to survey and challenge HUD LMI Survey

Surveying for LMI

Surveying

- Must be performed at a stricter Confidence Interval (minimum 95%) than U.S. Census Bureau
- Must be performed at a stricter MOE (minimum 5%)
- HUD non-LMI community must be within reasonable percentage of 51% LMI (typically within 5%).
