What is CDBG-DR?

Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery

- Housing, infrastructure, economic development
- Meeting a national objective
- Funding of last resort

Designed for long-term disaster recovery needs, not immediate relief



Why Housing Matters

- Restoring stability for displaced residents
- Strengthening community resilience
 - Communities continue to be affected when the tax base leaves



Project Types

- Single-Family New Construction Housing (Homebuyer Program)
- Owner-Occupied Rebab/Reconstruction
- Multifamily Development (Rehab/Recon OR New Construction)
- Mixed-use (housing with services)



Planning for the Future in the Present

- Pre-disaster conditions that may affect housing
 - Affordability
 - Deteriorating Housing Stock
 - o Homebuyer vs. Renter
- Ask:
 - What housing gaps exist in your community right now?



Acquisition and Development

- Buying properties for redevelopment
- On and off-site infrastructure improvements
- New construction of single-family or multifamily housing
 - o How does the national objective factor in?
 - Targeting mixed-income development
- Key Considerations:
 - Location and environmental review requirements
 - Infrastructure accessibility
 - Building healthy communities





Connecting Disaster Survivors to Opportunities

- Implement clear intake guidelines
- Prioritization
- Timing opportunities to prevent frustration



How Local Governments Can Lead the Charge

- Local governments, states, and non-profit housing partners traditionally are awarded CDBG-DR funds
- Partnering with pre-existing housing agencies in the community is essential



Early Steps in Planning

- Community engagement & needs assessment
- Project feasibility & timelines
- Cost estimates & layered funding
- Applying for funds and administering a project
 - Identifying your partners: grant administering, engineering, developers
