

Ground disturbance within or near archaeological sites owned or maintained by a city, county, or state government within Kentucky requires a permit from the Office of State Archaeology at the University of Kentucky prior to work beginning.



A Need to Know Basis

The more useful information an applicant provides us, the less likely it is we will have to recommend field investigations, particularly when asking for **photographs**, information on **disturbance**, and **records reviews**.

If we have to request additional information, we require an entirely new comprehensive submission. This starts the 30-day clock over.

Everyone's submission is the most important project to them. Everyone puts a High Importance tag on their submissions.

A project area within existing ROW is not Less likely to contain significant cultural resources.




Having a property listed on the National Register does NOT protect it

Report Narrative

Upon submission of a proposal by (enter applicant and agency) to (describe proposed activities resulting in ground disturbance) at (enter APE location), (name all field staff) conducted a site visit to this location. The purpose of this site visit was merely to determine the presence or absence of archaeological materials.

Previous disturbances to the area of potential effect (APE) include (disturbances). Historic map data indicated (a structure, etc., if any – describe where); however, no evidence was found during this survey. A Project Registration and Request for Archaeological Site and Project Area Information was conducted with the Office of State Archaeology on (date). How To Submit your Section 106 documentation so as not to hold your project up



If you have visible project elements and above ground properties 50 years of age or more in or visible from your project area, we need the information.

OSA: Below Ground Cultural Resources



If your project involves ground disturbance of any kind other than replacement within the exact footprint - nothing more - we need this information.




